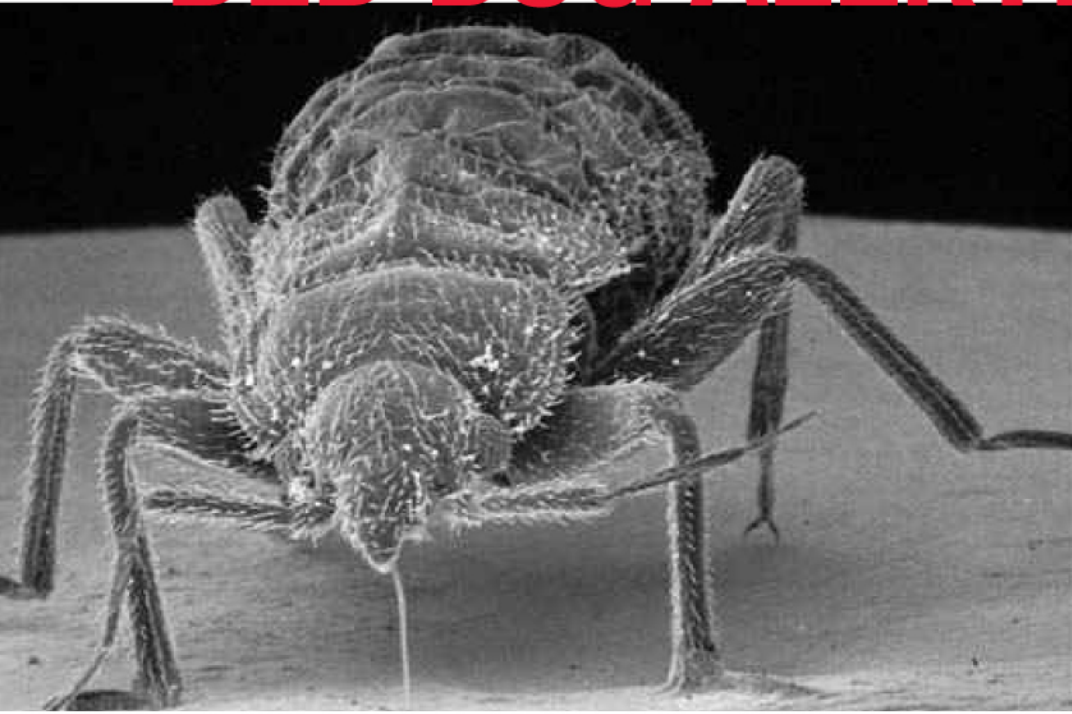


BED BUG ALERT!



BED BUGS ARE:

Constantly being dispersed via used furniture, luggage and bedding

About 1/5th of an inch and can readily be seen with the naked eye

Wingless, oval/flattened in appearance and crawl at a steady rate

Active at night

Bed bug bites are normally two or three in a row and often deposit blood on the sheeting. Look for bed bugs under folds in mattresses, along seams, in between bedposts and bed slats. You have the best chance of finding them active in the middle of the night.
